


The Friends of Woodcote Primary School Parent, Teacher and Friends Association (PTFA) would like to extend a warm welcome to our new children, parents and carers.

So, what is the PTFA?




The PTFA is a registered charity which is run by people like you with the aim of raising funds to help provide extra facilities not usually paid for by the LEA.

The PTFA helps to build the school's sense of community. Our volunteers enjoy building links between home, school and the local community to organise events throughout the year. The PTFA brings people together socially to have a good time and raise much needed funds for the school.

Funds are spent to increase the social and educational opportunities for our children. The Woodcote Primary School PTFA is run by volunteers who believe it's not just about fundraising; it's about enjoying our community and having fun!

Who is the PTFA?



We all are! All parents and carers of children at our school are automatically members of the PTFA. It is up to you how involved you become. Many parents find being an active member of the PTFA a great way to have their say on how the school is run.

We choose how PTFA funds are spent and that means your opinion counts too!




Fundraising over the years

The PTFA hold a Teddy Bear's Picnic each year for new nursery children and parents. Monthly coffee mornings are run so that you can meet other parents and PTFA volunteers. We even organise the school Christmas trees and a visit from Santa each year. . . and that's not to mention raffles, quiz nights, discos and two annual Fairs.

The PTFA has helped to pay for items such as:

- The outdoor classroom in the Key Stage 2 playground
- Computer Equipment, Whiteboards and Sports kits
- Books and Rainy Play equipment for classes
- Musical Instruments
- Fabulous and fun events such as our annual Easter Egg Hunt



How does the PTFA work?

The Woodcote Primary School PTFA is run by a Committee of volunteers. The Committee consists of a Chair, Vice-Chair, Treasurer and Secretary who, with further general Committee members volunteer at the Annual General Meeting (AGM). Everyone on the Committee puts a lot of hard work and effort into making the PTFA successful to support the school and our children.

The Committee meets each term to discuss events, spending and to vote on current issues. Sub-Committees work on specific events and tasks such as the summer fair, communications and sponsorships and meet as regularly as they need to.

Each New Year our AGM is held in the winter term so that new parents have the opportunity to get involved once they have settled in at school. The AGM gives you the chance to come along and hear how successful events have been, how funds have been spent in the previous year and to make any comments or suggestions you feel are important at this time.

At this meeting Committee members and Class Representatives are agreed for the coming year. A list of the current PTFA Committee members is included in this guide and an updated list can be found on the PTFA [website](#).

Class Representatives

Class Reps are a very important recent introduction by the PTFA. As a readily accessible point of contact Class Representatives form a link between individual classes and the PTFA Committee. They keep classes informed about events, provide feedback and gauge opinion on spending decisions. They also organise class volunteers, especially useful for the Summer Fair where there may be competition for the 'best stall' prize!

How the PTFA communicates

The PTFA send out termly [newsletters](#) and regular reminders on up and coming events by email and on [Facebook](#). We run monthly Coffee Mornings and also provide printed notifications and you will also see posters around the school to remind you about what is going on and any help that is required.
